## Week 10

In math, we continued learning about portioning plane shapes, such as circles, rectangles, squares and other shapes into two and four equal shares. We know that we can describe the shares using the words "halves", "fourths" and "quarters." We know that as we divide or partition into more equal shares that the shares get smaller in size. We've also learned how to read/write basic fractions (Ex. ½ and ¼) and know the top number indicates how many shares are being taken and the bottom number indicates how many equal shares there are altogether.

In Reading, we've been answering questions with question words like: Who, What, Where, When, Why and How using literary texts. We are practicing formulating our answers into complete sentences (either verbally and/or written) and making sure to use the text to support our answers.

In Social Studies we learned about Christopher Columbus and how he was an explorer that set sail across the Atlantic Ocean in search of a faster route to India in 1492. We learned that he traveled by ship and it wasn't an easy journey.

In Writing, we are learning to start our writing with a topic sentence and use temporal words (First, Next, Then,) to add our supporting details. We are practicing how to proofread/edit our work by color coding. We circle capitals with green and end punctuation with red. Most students have a goal of writing 3 complete sentences on their own.
