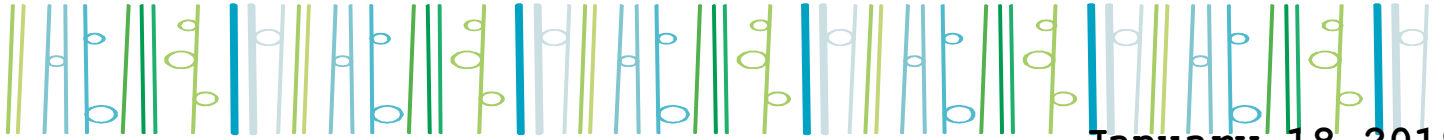

What's been happening in our classroom this week?

Week 22

In math, we finished our unit on graphing. We learned that data is information that is collected and represented in different ways: tally marks, pictographs & bar graphs. We know that with tally marks, the 5th mark is a diagonal mark to make counting the tally marks faster. We also know that graphs have titles and labeled categories. This week we got to practice collecting our own data with goldfish crackers and gummy bears to create tally charts, bar graphs, answer questions and create our own questions.

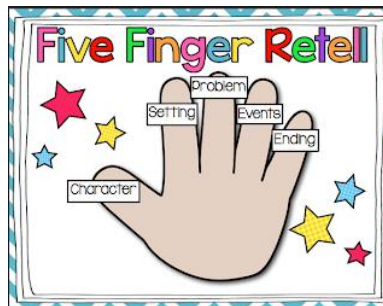
In Reading, we've been reading literary texts to think critically and create questions on our own. I am challenging us to answer our own questions already by using the key details from the text. This helps us know whether our question is a good question or not. We are referencing the Five Finger Retell to help us create our own questions.

In Science, we finished learning about the human life cycle and how it is a pattern in life. We know that living things, such as plants and animals, also have a life cycle. We learned that we are learning skills at school and home to be independent and that we can never go backwards in the life cycle.

In Writing, we are learning to indent and start our writing with a topic sentence, use temporal words (First, Next, Then, Last, Finally,) to add our supporting details, and end with a closing sentence. We are focusing on writing informational or how-to writing pieces this quarter. We are practicing how to proofread/edit our work by color coding. We circle capitals with green, circle end punctuation with red, underline nouns with yellow, underline conjunctions with pink and underline adjectives with black. Most students have a goal of writing 5 complete sentences and 1 super-sized sentence (using a conjunction) on their own this quarter.
